KidCo Head Start / Early Head Start

KEEP is an evidence-based support and skill enhancement education program for foster and kinship parents of children aged 5 to 12 and teens (KEEP SAFE[™]). The program supports foster families by promoting child well-being and preventing placement breakdowns.
